People might be financially 'poor' but they have a large pool of skills and social resources. Skill training is becoming a strong medium of employment for the youth, especially with the manufacture of Lacquer bangles and materials, Lac cultivation will prove to be an

inspirational endeavor. Water harvesting has been started through an innovative experiment which will prove to be a boon in the geographical location of Jharkhand.

Needless to mention, these works would not have been possible without the support of RJSS's board of trustees, management, well-wishers, supporters, frontline workers, and members.

We have accomplished all this with a dedicated team working day and night to bring solutions to the problems, a large army of passionate, committed volunteers, contributors and people who have supported us with material, time, efforts, dedication, networks and hard work. The conviction to stick with each other has made this journey beautiful. Going forward in the face of new issues, challenges our path will also evolve and emerge around people and will bring new hopes for a better future.

Our History

In Jharkhand for more than 20 years, RJSS has been empowering women and girls from the most marginalized communities and improving their lives and livelihoods. Given the scale and depth of challenges that we face in reducing poverty, addressing inequalities and social injustices, especially among marginalized women and girls in Jharkhand, strategic partnerships in the social development space are critical for bringing about significant and sustainable change within communities. Over the last financial year, RJSS has joined hands with donors, governments, peers, civil society, and other partners who have contributed towards RJSS vision and mission, and our collaborative work has resulted in outcomes that are more than the sum of its parts. We directly reached out to 50800 people in Jharkhand states, worked in 7 districts and implemented fifteen projects across health, education, livelihoods and disaster preparedness and response. From developing foundational learning and leadership skills in girls to helping provide basic health services including maternal and neonatal care at public health facilities to empowering women engaged in small agriculture to gain greater control over their economic resources and providing relief and rehabilitation during disasters, child marriage, water conservation, child rights, vocational training our partners have stood with us shoulder to shoulder to enable us to deliver the desired outcomes. This report provides a glimpse of our work and of those who helped us realise our goals. RJSS is a not-for-profit organization working in Jharkhand for more than 20 years, focusing on alleviating poverty and social injustice. We do this through well planned and comprehensive projects in health, education, livelihoods, and disaster preparedness and response. Our overall goal is the empowerment of women and girls from poor and marginalized communities leading to improvement in their lives and livelihoods. During the year 2020-21, RJSS directly reached out to 25300 people through six projects across 6 districts. We are working in over six districts, for a world where people live with dignity and security. OUR GOAL Women and girls from the most marginalized communities are empowered, live in dignity, and their households have secure and resilient lives. RJSS aims to accomplish this goal by working with 25300 people to help them meet their health, education and livelihoods entitlements and aspirations.

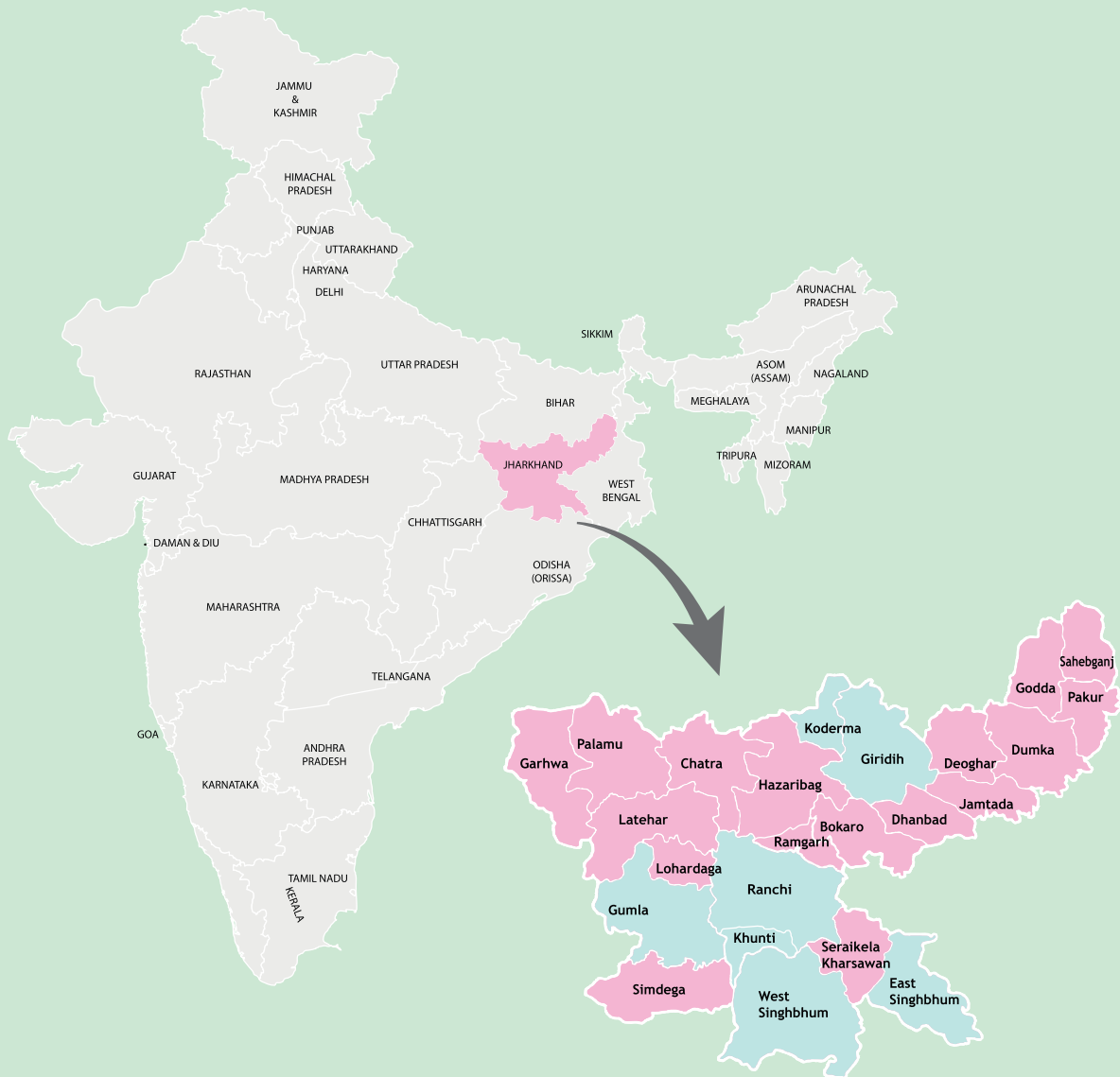

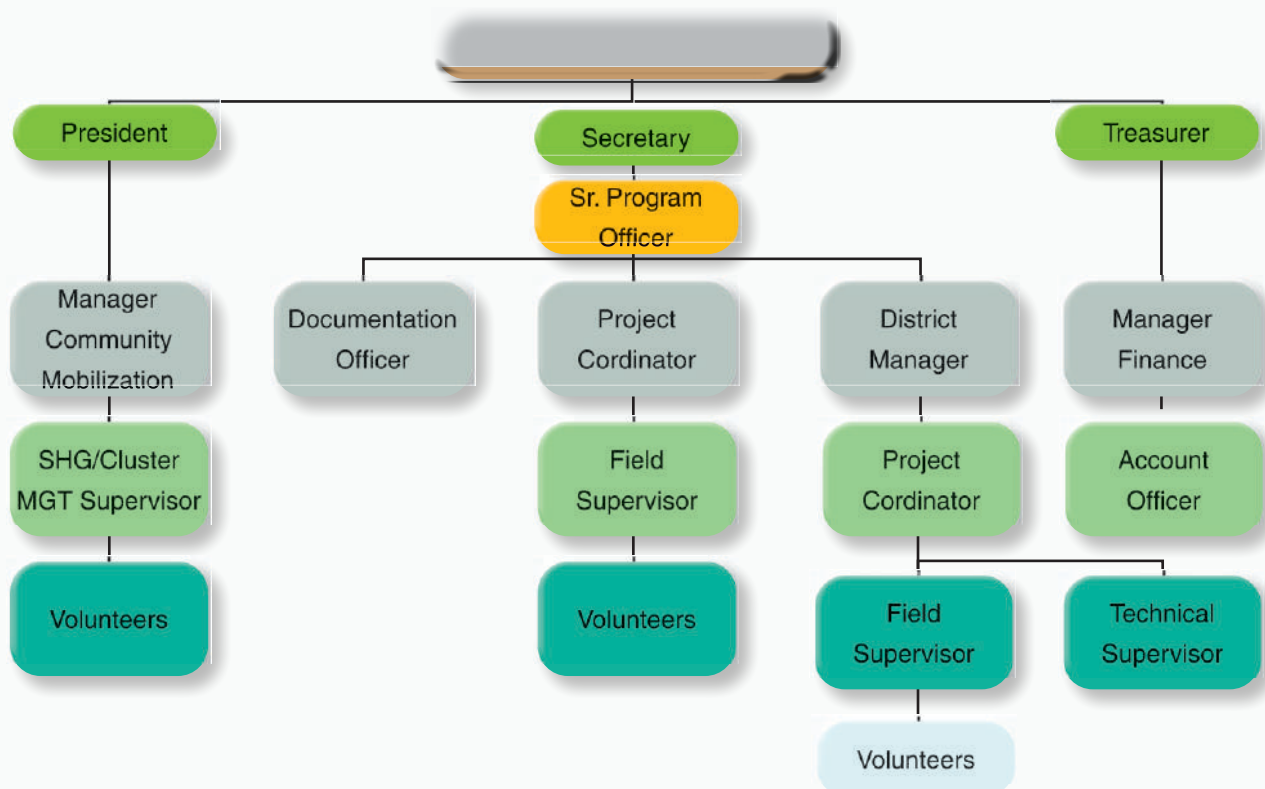

ASHRAM

The Ashram under Rashtriya Jharkhand Seva Sansthan enlightens the people towards finding new livelihood opportunity, the poor people place of solace, comfort, cheer. RJSS is proud to have more people on the soil of small Ashram, could continue serving the poor people since 2001, the community comfortably comes and find respect, solutions., execute Lok Adalat to solve villager's family and other village level problems which abstains going court of Law, it is an abode of development where planning and development work begins such as child right, health, education, protection of environment, forest protection etc. The Ashram is established with a view to provide a wave of happiness in the face of villagers, is truly realizing the vision. This is a centre of training for different socio economic trades such as Craftsmanship, vermin compost, leaf plate, embroidery and tailoring for youths, adolescents and women group especially to the SHGs. The Ashram has now ChildLine sub centre.



The idea behind starting this project is to connect MICA affected children with the main stream of education. The project is being implemented among 912 families of 10 villages i.e. Halkusha, Matukdih, Jagnidih, Mathuradih, Khab, Gajdih, Manorthdih, Ghudmudia, Jhanjhidi and Bhagadih of Khutta and Tehro panchayats of Satgawan block, Koderma. The three main objectives of the project are:

1. Education

2. Security

3. Health and Nutrition

Mobile health camp: - RJSS in collaboration with CRY organized Health camp in Matukdih, Jaganidih, Bhagadih, Jhanjhidi and Gajdih villages of the project area, in which total 364 villagers of the project area were treated and free medicines were distributed. In this health camp, diseases like cold, fever, cough, puffiness, headache, body pain, knee pain, eye problems, itching, weakness, covid-19 test etc. were treated.

Remedial Class: - Under MICHI project, Remedial Class is being organized by RJSS and CRY in Jhanjhidi and Matukdih villages of project area, which is being conducted by Ramprasad Dev and Sikandar Prasad Yadav. In this, a total of 70 children who are weak in studies and whose family's financial condition is not good are being given free education. Along with education, TLM has also distributed among the children so that the children of MICA affected families do not become a burden on their family. Apart from this, monthly evaluation test is also being done to make the children aware about the changes happening in them.

Orientation of Students appearing 10th board exams 2022:- Under the joint aegis of RJSS and CRY, orientation workshop of students appearing in 10th board exam 2022 was organized in all 10 villages of the project area. Examination Guide was also distributed among total 50 adolescents of the project area.

Interface meeting with anganwadi worker: - An interface meeting with 10 village Sevika, Sahiya and Poshan Sakhi was organized in Khutta Panchayat Bhawan of the project area, in which Anganwadi Sevika, Sahiya, and Poshan Sakhi made aware about six services provided by the Government to Anganwadi. Simultaneously, training on growth monitoring was also done, so that malnourished children could be identified in all 10 villages of the project area. Weighting machine was distributed to all the 10 Anganwadi workers by RJSS and CRY. As a result, a total of 34 malnourished children and 7 underweight children were identified, who have referred for the treatment to the MTC center located in the community health center. 4 children have been brought from red grade to yellow grade. 34 underweight children have been cured by home remedies and 14 malnourished children have also been cured.

MNREGA Advocacy Camp: - MNREGA Advocacy Camp workshop was organized under the joint aegis of RJSS, CRY and Administration. A total of 544 people were given job cards by setting up camps in the area, due to which people are getting 100 days of work in a year and they are getting wages of Rs 225 per day. Efforts are also being made to bring changes in the lives of common people.

Capacity Building Workshop of School Management Committee: - There are total 7 schools in the project area in which 4 primary schools and 3 secondary schools are located. Home visit was done and all the parents of the project area were informed about the importance of SMC, as well as everyone was inspired to make an intellectual person of the village as the SMC president by which an attempt was made to reorganize the SMC in all

the 7 schools of the project area and make the SMC president and members aware of the work and responsibility through the workshop. Children have been also connected with online to ensure the education of children during the Covid-19 pandemic. SMC members got success in connecting 86 children of the area through online classes. A total of 74 new children were enrolled in all the 7 schools of the state and 14 irregular children got admission in schools.

RCH (Reproductive Child Health) Training for Adolescent Girls: - A total of 72 adolescent girls from all 10 villages of the work area were given RCH training in Khutta Panchayat Bhawan of the project area. Adolescent girls said that they are facing problems due to non-availability of IFA tablets in the area, after which effort was done to make available tablets to the adolescents, as a result of which about 40% of the adolescent girls in the area are consuming regular IFA tablets.





Child Line Toll Free Number 1098 is a 24-hour free emergency calling and access services provided by Government of India. This is for children who need care and protection. Under this, assistance is provided to such children who are being exploited and harassed mentally, financially, physically, and emotionally, as well as Childline helps in cases of child marriage, child labour, child sexual abuse, child trafficking, lost found etc. For the last five years, Child Line Sub Center is functioning smoothly and continuously in Satgawan and Markacho blocks of Koderma district.

Block Childline Advisory Board meeting: A meeting of the Block Childline Advisory Board was organized in the auditorium of the Block Office Markacho. In the said meeting, Block Development Officer, Block Education Extension Officer, Director Child Line, Block Head, Station In-charge, Chief, Health worker were present. The main objective of the meeting was to end child exploitation in Markacho block. All the dignitaries present gave their feedback regarding child protection and the problems of the children were discussed.

Celebration of Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar Jayanti: Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar Jayanti was celebrated by the team members of Childline Sub Center in the presence of Block Development Officer Shri Baijnath Urao at Pehalwan Ashram Bhakra. During this program all the dignitaries present garlanded the photo of Babasaheb Ambedkar.

Distribution of sanitary pads, masks and sanitizers among girls: The Organisation got information by the Anganwadi worker and girls that due to the lockdown, the girls are unable to go to the market and they are compulsively using clothes during menstruation, due to which there is a possibility of spreading more diseases; therefore Sanitary pads, masks, sanitizers were distributed among 30 girls in Pokhardiha by Childline team.

Chowkidar meeting: Team members of Childline Sub Center organized a Chowkidar meeting among the block Chowkidars in the premises of Markaccho police station. Police station in-charge Sanjay Sharma was also present in this meeting. He told that the police are with Childline 24 hours for the service and need of the children.

Awareness meeting with Mahila Mandal for Child Protection: An awareness program was organized to give information about the ill-effects of child marriage and child labor. To make Koderma district child marriage, child labor free, Deputy Commissioner, Mr. Aditya Ranjan asked the Child Protection Committee, Child Line JSLPS, to run an awareness campaign. The Mahila Mandal told that we will make everyone aware against child marriage in our work area and if we see child marriage or child labor happening, we will inform it on 1098.

Awareness meeting with Panchayat level PRI member and frontline worker: An awareness meeting on child rights and prevention from third wave of COVID-19 was held with Panchayat level PRI member and frontline workers in the courtyard of Panchayat Secretariat. In this meeting it was discussed that how to protect our children from the third wave of COVID-19 and what would be our responsibility towards it. In the said meeting all the Sevikas of the Mukhiya Panchayat, teachers, ward members and Sahiya were present and all expressed their feedback on child protection. Everyone present in the meeting took an oath that if any child labor, child marriage or child abuse is seen, then they will inform it on 1098.

Awareness meeting with Sevikas for child protection: Sevika meeting was organized in the presence of District Child Protection Officer and Protection Officer along with the Sevikas of the block in the courtyard of Block Office Satgawan. In the said meeting, Protection Officer Archana

Jawan told how children are being physically abused these days, he said that we need to give physical education to our girls. The District Child Protection Officer said that the children whose parents have died due to corona should be identified and reported on 1098 so that the benefit of PM Cares Fund scheme can be given to that child.

Meeting on Child Protection with Block ANM:

An awareness meeting on child protection was held with all the Block ANMs in the premises of Community Health Center Satgawan. ANMs told that we work in different villages of all the blocks and we keep children informed about the ill effects of Corona as well as measures to be taken for protection from the virus.

Painting and Rangoli competition: Painting and Rangoli competition was organized with children in BS National Public School. 30 children participated in this competition, all the children made this program successful by making pictures of child marriage, child labor, environment, prevention of coronavirus, water conservation, cleanliness etc. The main objective of conducting this program was that children could understand child abuse, water conservation, cleanliness and prevention from corona through these pictures. During the program, children were given information about the work of Childline and how to avoid corona epidemic.

Candle March against child marriage, child labor and child exploitation: On the eve of Children's Day, a candle march was organized in the presence of Block Development Officer and Block Head. Children covered 1.5 kms distance. The main objective of the said program was to create a block free from child marriage, child labor and child exploitation. In this candle march, all the children raised slogans for stopping child marriage and child labor, education etc. The development officer said that by doing such a program, children will get aware

about the child exploitation. Slogans were raised against child marriage and child labor and everyone took oath to build a child exploitation free block.

International Human Rights: Human Rights Day was celebrated in the premises of Block Secretariat Nawadih. Mukhiya, Public Representatives, Teachers and Children were present in this program. During the program children got aware about the child labor and child marriage.

Awareness camp: On the auspicious occasion of Mahashivratri, awareness cum help camp was organized in a three-day fair in the premises of Ghudmeshwar Dham temple. The main purpose of organizing this camp was to arrange a help camp to solve the problems of the children and devotees who came to the fair. During the three-day fair, children and devotees were assisted in any kind of health-related problem through this aid camp. Medical team, Childline team, police administration were present in the camp and with the support of everyone, help was provided to many children and devotees.

Chowkidaar Meeting: Chowkidaar meeting was organized with all the Block Chowkidars in the premises of Satgawan police station. In this program, Information about the work of Childline was given and the problem of children was discussed.

- Ration material was distributed among many needy children during lockdown and corona virus.
- Vaccination chaupal was organized by our team in different villages of the block to get the Covid vaccination done during the corona epidemic and people were made aware about vaccination. As a result of which, many people got vaccinated.
- Many children who came astray were reunited with their families by our team and police administration.
- Newborn baby found thrown in the bush was taken to the children's home by our team.

Open House Program: Open House Program was organized in many schools of Satgawan and Markacho block by Satgawan Child Line Sub Center. Many school children and teachers participated in this program. During the program, drawing rangoli competition was also organized, due to which there was a lot of enthusiasm among the children.

Friendship with Childline program : Like every year, this year also child line friendship program was organized in two blocks of the district. This program ran from 14 November to 21 November. During this program, children tied friendship band to each other and the information of Childline 1098 was given.

Activities done

- Gram Suvidha Kendra has been opened in all the 8 villages of project area
- With the help of Pragya Kendra, a total of 571 people were registered through the camp for making e-shram card at Village Suvidha Kendra, in which 542 people got cards.
- 40 people have applied under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, , in which 3 people got approval and the rest are in the process of approval
- With the help of the Customer Service Center, a total of 106 people were linked with Life Insurance by organizing a camp at the Village Suvidha Kendra
- A camp was organized in the Gram Suvidha Kendra with the help of Pragya Kendra, in which 96 people were registered for making Ayushman cards. Golden cards have been issued to 45 people. The remaining cards are in the process of being made.

Livelihood

In order to generate income among Mica based families, asset support was provided by the organization on the basis of their demand, so that alternative arrangement of livelihood can be ensured. 20 beneficiaries from 8 village got benefit from asset support for different activities like opening stores, buying Rikshaw, buying Electric Motor, Diesel Pump etc.

Operation of Community Facilitation Center

Keeping in view the needs of Mica based family; a Community Facilitation Centre was established by RJSS On 15th April, 2021, which was inaugurated by the Block Development Officer of Satgawan, Shri Vaidyanath Oraon.

In this Inauguration ceremony, Mica family of 8 villages of the project area was present. After the ceremony, a meeting between BDO and beneficiary was organized, in which complete information about the documents and rules of the Center were given. Identity card was also distributed among the beneficiaries for getting benefit from the centre. A total of 55 Mica families are getting benefit from the community facility center in three months. Every day three to four people are reaching the center for wheat milling and in only one month, total savings of Rs. 3287 was done by millig.

Professional Training of Youth

To generate income for the youth, electronic training was given to 4 youths in 8 villages of the project area as well as motor driving training was organized among 9 youths for one month at the Community Facility Center of Satgawan block by a skilled trainer. After the training, all the participants are doing income generation activity by becoming skilled professionals.

To ensure alternative arrangements for income generation in 8 villages of the project area, various activities were conducted by forming small groups

of women entrepreneur, which are as follows:-

1) Flour packing - A group of 4 needy women was formed in village Angar of the project area, which was named as “Sita Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal”. Women prepare flour, packing and selling it in the market, as well as storing and keeping accounts. They do all the work themselves.

2) Spice Packing - A group of 4 women has been formed in village Angar, just like flour packing, the business of packing spices, toor dal and soap has also been started.

RJSS's pioneering efforts to ensure work and income security, food security, social security, self-reliance for women and youth, and its mobilization and empowerment of, make it a major agent of change in rural areas. RJSS encourages the creation of economic structures and providing sustainable livelihood security to rural poor. Its professionals continue to expand productively to improve the living and working condition in the area.



Health and nutrition Health Camps: RJSS recognizes the challenges of the underprivileged to access primary healthcare and it therefore organizes **free multispecialty health camps** across geographies which includes a **thorough check up by a doctor, distribution of free medicines along with specialized tests namely BP, Blood Sugar and Haemoglobin(Hb)** monitoring. These timely interventions provide early diagnosis and treatment reducing the incidence of morbidity and mortality. Such health camps address immediate health care needs of the marginalized communities. RJSS has organized **four health camps during the last financial year** and a total of 325 people have been provided health check-up and medicine. People were also informed about the government health facility.

COVID-19 Vaccination Camp: In all the 8 villages of the project area, an intensive survey of people above 45 years of age left out of COVID-19 vaccination was done, in which 174 people were identified. Thereafter survey report was made available to the district administration and Route chart was prepared for setting up camp. A day before the camp, all the people were informed about vaccination. 115 people above 45 years and 60 years were vaccinated in the project area.

On 31st May, 2021, the COVID-19 Vaccination Camp was organized in Mobile Van by RJSS with support from the Block and Community Health Center at Khirikala and Yogidih village of Ambabad and Khutta Panchayat. Over 29

people above the age of 45 years were vaccinated on this camp.

Awareness was created by the Worker, Sahiya, Sevika and Block Development Officer among the people on the rapid spread of the viral infection and the safety measures to be taken. The Organisation made all the necessary arrangements for this vaccination camp to be carried out smoothly, following COVID-19 protocols and social distancing norms. With this Vaccination Camp, the organisation hopes to make the lives of all the community members more protected from the Covid-19 virus. A Choupal was also organized, as a result of which 65 percent people above 45 and above in Satgawan have taken the vaccine.

Organizing nutrition camp: In order to make the project area malnutrition free village, weight checking of children in the age group of 3 to 6 was done and these children were therefore screened through tricolor strip. After that, a 15-days non-resident nutrition camp was organized for underweight children. In this nutrition camp, mothers of underweight children have undergone through training with various activities and they were informed that how to take care of their children. Cleanliness training and changing the behavioral and food practices in mothers for their children was also provided. After the training, Washkit and seeds were distributed to all the children for planting nutrition garden, as well as the assessment of all the children was done regularly for four months. After assessing, the conclusion of 8 villages of the project came out which are as follows:

Education

RJSS in collaboration with RMI under CESAM network organised two special classe in the project area, in which 61 such children whose financial condition was not good and who were weak in studies were selected and enrolled with special classes. These children were selected through written and oral tests and their studies were regularly conducted for free for six months. Reading materials were also provided to the children.

Scholarship for Continuing Education

Reading materials were made available to the children of 6 Bal Manch, which helped children in regularizing their studies. Scholarship amount was also provided among 26 children and these children are spending the amount mainly on their Tution Fee and purchasing stationaries. 7 children who received scholarship by the organisation passed in class 10th with first class, and these children were summoned by the Block Development Officer. All children are being tracked regularly.



Aspirational training of Teachers on activity based learning

TLM based teachers training was organized on 8th October, 2021 at Panchayat Bhawan Khutta. A total of 16 people, two teachers each from 8 schools of project area participated in the training. Training was provided by Shri Vijay Kumar and Vikas Kumar, trained teachers from the department. Teachers were trained through various types of TLMs available in the school.



Events and Activities of Bal Manch

Children's Day celebration: On the occasion of Children's Day, a painting and writing competition on "Harmful effect of pollution on the environment" was organized among the children of Bal Manch. The participants who got first, second and third place in the competition were awarded with prizes. On this occasion, a football tournament of boys and girls was also organized. - **Kamli's story**

Born with multi disability, Kamli hails from a small village of Koderma district, Jharkhand. Kamli lost her mother at very early age and after the death of her mother her father's attitude towards Kamli changed drastically. Her family was poor and dependent on daily wages. She started feeling depressed.

Inspired by her entrepreneurial spirit and never-give-up attitude, RJSS team with the support of RMI identified Kamli's family as the neediest families and they had decided to give her financial support. Kamli tapped into her entrepreneurial spirit and with the support of RJSS team, she immediately abled to set up a small shop named “Kamli General Store” in her village to meet the basic needs of her family.

What worked in her favor though was her unyielding determination to be financially independent and be able to support her family. Kamali became capable in just eight months and she has become a source of inspiration for the society. She goes to the market once a week and with the help of her brothers and villagers, she buys goods for her shop herself. Besides she is also engaged in sewing clothes with her own sewing machine and in this way, she is able to save 2500-3000 rupees in a month.

In this sequence, organisation's personnel also helped Kamli in linking her Ayushman Card with the Disability Pratan Patraswami Vivekananda Pension Scheme, which has brought a wonderful change in her life. Kamali says I was depressed, was sad about my life, RJSS showed the way in my life by becoming a ray of hope and helped me financially and supported me like a family, due to which I am self-reliant today and living with happiness and peace. Now I am not a burden for my family. She says that in changing my life, I have got blessings and support of RJSS team. I am very thankful to the Organisation which made my life meaningful.

Van Raksha Bandhan Program

To balance the deteriorating balance of the environment and climate change, Van Raksha Bandhan is an effective and meaningful campaign, which has been started by RJSS since 2007 with determination, faith and brotherhood in the joint forest of Donaiah, Karchaita, Jamtoto and Mahatha Dih. The Program is being organized every year on 22nd February. As a result of which, the protection and security of forest and wildlife in about hundreds of hectares have been ensured by public participation, cooperation of the department and joint efforts of the organization. This effort has brought awareness among the people around. In this sequence, under the leadership of the Organization, this campaign has been started in the districts of Gumla, Simdega, Ranchi, Giridih, Khunti, Koderma, East Singhbhum and Chatra.



Livelihood Program

To ensure livelihood of Mica affected families, this program is being conducted for 495 families in four Panchayats Jarga, Bhodo, Megha Teri and one Nagar Panchayat Koderma Nau Gaon Mid of Koderma and Chandwara blocks.

Under this program, Revolving fund is being provided by the organization to the needy families affected by MICA and efforts are being made to make them financially self-dependent, so that their financial independence increases and their children live safely and enrolled with schools for continuing their education.

Till date, 282 families have been given financial assistance in the form of revolving fund to start different types of employment, animal husbandry and agriculture, due to which change can be seen in the lives of those Mica affected families.

SAFE MOBILITY

Migration has become an essential necessity of life. People migrating for the purpose of ensuring employment, livelihood as well as development, but before migration, the migrants leave without knowing about their rights and schemes run by the government, due to which they are also victims of various types of incidents. RJSS associated with the Jatan network for working on the issues of safe migration since the year 2012, creating an understanding on the issue of safe migration. 10 migrant groups have been formed in 3 Panchayats Lokai, Pandey Deh and Nagar Panchayat of Koderma block, and in 10 villages of Koderma and through them, a village level organization have been formed including Migrant family and the people who have returned from the migration. This group works to provide all the necessary information to the migrant family which they need.

To ensure safe migration, an information center has also been established, which ensures the right of women's mobility as well as human rights and paves the way for development.

CHILD MARRIAGE

Koderma is the district with the highest number of child marriages in the state. The status of child marriage is almost same in all the blocks of Koderma district. RJSS since its inception is committed to stop child marriage through various activities and is trying to stop it by spreading awareness about the ill effects, legal provision and consequences of child marriage.

To make the awareness campaign more effective, community training, seminar, street play are being done with the help of all the stakeholders like religious guru, social person, village child protection committee, administration, child marriage prohibition officer, child welfare committee and PRI members. Sensitization work is done through Pad Yatra, Candle March, Signature Campaign, Competition etc. Through RJSS, 297 child marriages have been prevented by forming, training, operating, Bal Manch and Kishori Mandal. RJSS got success in preventing 297 child marriages by forming and operating Bal Manch and Kishori Mandal. 50529 families have been filed affirmation that they will not do child marriage. RJSS's continuous struggle will continue till the end of child marriage and making Koderma a child marriage free district.

WATER CONSERVATION

"Jal Hai To Kal Hai" This proverb is irrefutable truth. RJSS is trying to sensitize, the general public about water conservation through different programs since 2004. Under this program, tree plantation, sack dam, natural forest conservation, construction of subsurface dike, cleaning of pond, dam, waterfall etc. have been completed.

RESPONSE TO COVID-19

Efforts have been made to help the people affected by the impact of Covid-19 by distribution of dry ration, masks, sanitizers etc. to along with the implementation of Government schemes of like construction of dobha, horticulture etc. Especially for the promotion of Covid vaccination, success has been achieved in getting about 25000 people directly vaccinated through Chaupal, street plays, wall writing etc.

SKILL TRAINING

It is well known that Koderma district is Mica affected district and due to most of the land being terraced, seasonal farming is possible here; therefore RJSS is striving towards the employment and development of rural through cash crop cultivation, local level availability, skill training etc.

LAC PRODUCTION AND CULTIVATION

There is a lot of potential and market for lacquer manufacturing like bangles, jewellery, file, earring, pen stand etc. Also good quality lacquer is cultivated in Jharkhand. It has a lot of potential in Koderma as well. Realizing this possibility, RJSS has started training and construction of the first level of lacquer bangle manufacturing, however there is a need for better training, which efforts are on to get it done with the help of NABARD.

VEGETABLE CULTIVATION

Vegetable cultivation can be a better livelihood and means of income in some areas of Koderma district and realizing the need of appropriate training and market management for that, the organization has taken forward by imparting training to the members of Farmers Club / Mahila Mandal / GLG / Aajeevika Sangh in a technical manner on off-season vegetables as well as agricultural products. In this work, 30 women have been trained for vegetable production in Khab Badal village of Satgawan block under MEDP in collaboration with NABARD Jharkhand, which has increased the enthusiasm among the people for vegetable production along with awareness.





MODEL SCHOOL / ANGANWADI

Rural children should get quality education from pre-school education to higher school and for creating educational environment, there is a need to make both Anganwadi Centers and Schools entertainment full and informative; therefore, RJSS has come forward in making model class of 05 Anganwadi centers (Pokhardiha, Samaydiha, Khawasdiha, Simratari and Pichhri) and 03 schools (Kushhaniyan, Mahathadiha, Simratari).



PRERNA

RJSS with the collaboration with Conexus Foundation implementing Project PRERNA in 3 districts of Jharkhand namely; Koderma, Deoghar and Chatra to create awareness of frontline health workers on RH blood factor in the state of Jharkhand. Through this program, team has created awareness about intuitional delivery, importance of knowing own blood group and mother & child health related to RH incompatibility, risk associated with it and importance of being under the consultation of the doctor for its prevention. The program had focused on awareness and facilitation campaign for women of reproductive ages between 20 and 40 years in the state of Jharkhand.

Rh incompatibility is a condition that develops when a pregnant woman has Rh-negative blood and the baby in her womb has Rh-positive blood. It occurs when a woman who is Rh-negative becomes pregnant with a baby with Rh-positive blood. With Rh incompatibility, the woman's immune system reacts and creates Rh antibodies.

RJSS has given training to total 4118 frontline workers of health and ICDS.

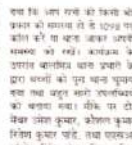

Findings and feedback -

During training it was found that around 50% to 60% of the participants were not aware about their own blood group. Awareness level among these frontline about RH Incompatibility was very low. Only few of them were aware about the topic but only had basic idea.

Participants were happy & satisfied to know about the untouched topic of RH factor. According to participants, they were really satisfied with the content that were delivered. They also shared that they felt like they learnt something new today and also didn't get bored.

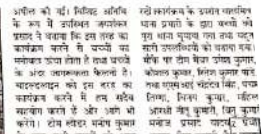

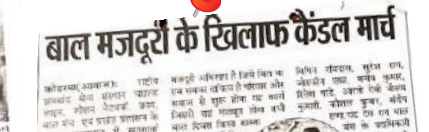

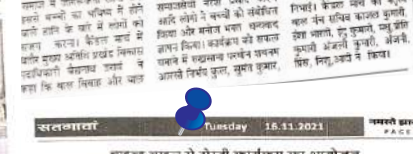
